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"Sr" - The Abbreviation for Surveyor

"Sr" is adopted as the abbreviation for surveyor by The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors. The pronunciation for "Sr" is "surveyor".

In order to promote its use to the public, corporate members are encouraged to adopt the abbreviation "Sr" in front of their English names in their official communications. Likewise, corporate members are also invited to address themselves as "測量師" after their Chinese names.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As December will be my last month as President of the HKIS, I would like to express my thanks to all of you for your support and encouragement throughout the past 11 months. I am pleased by the achievements we have made this year and even more excited about our future.

The past month has been a busy month for both the HKIS and myself. On November 7, I was invited by the Financial Secretary's Office to the consultation meeting on the 2014 Policy Address and 2014-15 Budget. I represented the HKIS and shared our views on the directions of the upcoming Policy Address and Budget, whereas a written submission setting out our concerns and suggestions regarding the consultation will be submitted in December.

In the evening of the same day, I chaired the Long Term Housing Strategy (LTHS) Discussion Forum held at the Surveyors Learning Centre. With the facilitation of our panellists and members of our policy panel, Sr Augustine Wong and Sr Eddie Hui, the forum was both informative and fruitful. The LTHS Task Force has consolidated members' views and our collective feedback on the LTHS proposal will be submitted to the Government in early December.

During November 10-13, I led a 16 HKIS-member delegation to Beijing. It was our third CEPA visit. During the stay, the delegation met senior officials of a number of government bodies. You can read a detailed account of the visit and some of its photos on Pages 9-11 of this issue of Surveyor Times. The purposes of the visits were to understand the relevant regulations and Mainland policies, to foster professional knowledge exchanges, and to explore further collaborative opportunities so as to enhance the development of the surveying profession in Hong Kong and in the Mainland. The delegation also attended the official opening ceremony cum dinner of the HKIS Beijing office.

On November 12, a housewarming party was held to celebrate the opening of the HKIS Beijing office, the first

representative office of the HKIS in the Mainland. More than 60 members, officials from various Mainland ministries and senior members of other professional institutes attended the party. It was also our honour to have Director of Department of Enterprise of the Ministry of Finance of the People's Republic of China, Mr Liu Yu Ting; the Development Bureau Permanent Secretary for Development (Works), Mr Wai Chising; and Hong Kong Legislative Council member, Mr Tse Wai Chuen, as our Guests of Honour to unveil the HKIS plaque and kick off the official opening.

As the co-operations between Hong Kong surveyors and other industry players in the Mainland continue to deepen, the Beijing representative office will enable us to provide better services to our members being stationed in the Mainland, facilitate closer communications with our Mainland counterparts, and strengthen our ties with relevant Mainland authorities. As our Mainland membership continues to grow, we are looking to open more



representative offices in other cities in the future.



After officiating the opening ceremony of the HKIS Beijing Office, at the invitation of the organisers, I attended the seminars held on the first day of the 2013 International Project Management Conference

held in Shanghai during November 13-15.

The conference was co-organised by Shanghai Construction Consultants Trade Association (SCCA), Shanghai Xian Dai Architectural Design (Group) Co., Ltd., Tongji University, Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyor (RICS) and AACE International. Over 260 delegates from the Mainland, Hong Kong, America, France, Italy, Singapore and Malaysia, etc, consisting of government officials, professionals and industry players, gathered to exchange their views on various subjects revolving around the "current development and future trends in project management".

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The 7th Cross-Strait Geomatics Conference was successfully held on November 21-23 in Hong Kong. The conference was co-organised by four organisations, namely the Lands Department of HKSAR, the HKIS, the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, and the Hong Kong Institution of Engineering Surveyors (HKIES).



This office aims to provide services to our members who are stationed on the Mainland, facilitate closer communications with our Mainland counterparts, and strengthen liaisons with the Mainland authorities. To celebrate its opening, a housewarming party was held on 12 November at the new office with over 60 members, officials from various Mainland ministries, and senior members of professional institutes. We were delighted to have Director of Department of Enterprise of the Ministry of Finance of the People's Republic of China, Mr Liu Yu Ting; Permanent Secretary for Development (Works), Mr Wai Chi-sing; and Hong Kong Legislative Council member, Mr Tse Wai Chuen as our Guests of Honour to unveil the HKIS plaque and kick off the official opening. Guests and members mingled with each other during the celebration. The Beijing opening marks a milestone for the HKIS. Led by the HKIS President, Sr Stephen Lai, everyone toasted to the prosperity of the institute.



Long Term Housing Strategy Discussion Forum

The Long Term Housing Strategy (LTHS) Steering Committee announced a consultation document on Hong Kong's long term housing strategy on 3 September and kicked off a three-month public consultation exercise. In order to collect members' views on the subject, a discussion forum was held on 7 November 2013 in the Surveyors Learning Centre.

The President, Sr Stephen Lai, was the first speaker to deliver a briefing, followed by Sr Edward Au, panel member of Land Policy Panel; Sr Vincent Ho, Chairman of the Building





Policy Panel; and Sr Lawrence Poon, Chairman of Housing Policy Panel. The forum ended with a roundtable discussion led by Sr Lai, Sr Augustine Wong, Sr Eddie Hui, and the representatives of the Policy Panel. This was followed by an open discussion.

The forum was informative and inspiring. The LTHS task force will consolidate members' views and submit its feedback on the proposal to the government before the end of the consultation period in early December.

BSD Chairman's Report presented at the AGM

I am delighted to report on the following activities we organised or participated in over the last 12 months.

1. Keeping up with the Qianhai Development project in order to utilise the expertise of building surveyors

We are actively involved with the Shenzhen Project Management Engineers Association (深圳市監理工程師協會) in discussions with the Qianhai Authorities. We signed a framework agreement on 9 December 2012 with the Association to promote the joint implementation of professional services by both organisations for the development of Qianhai District.

Several meetings with the Authorities and the Association were held to discuss the future of project management for building projects in the Qianhai District. It was understood that the Qianhai Authorities will appoint a local GP Surveying firm to deal with land disposal matters in order to ensure cooperation between Hong Kong's professionals and their counterparts in Shenzhen.

2. Implementation of APC Reforms for AMHKIS

Although no AMHKIS candidate sat for the 2013 Practical Task, the task was designed to cater to technical and professional assessments. With the experience gained this year, the task will be further fine-tuned to suit the first batch of AMHKIS candidates who will be assessed in 2014.

3. Launch of the Professional Guide for the Detection and Diagnosis of Water Seepage in Residential Buildings

The main contents of the study were completed and its steering committee is now reviewing the presentation of the guide, which will be launched in the near future.

4. Finalisation of the Professional Guide for Building Inspection

With the dedicated efforts of the research team and the steering committee, the Professional Guide to Building Inspection Volume 1: Pre-1980 Residential and Composite Buildings in Hong Kong was published in September. Corporate Members can get a free copy from our administration office.

5. HKIS Building Surveying Scholarship and Eddie Lee Memorial Education Foundation for Secondary School Students

Out of the ten awardees of the 2012 Scholarship, one is now studying surveying at HKU. This awardee's second stage scholarship is now being arranged. The 2013 Scholarship received another record-breaking round of applications and the working group is now conducting the necessary assessments. We hope that the presentation of the scholarships can be arranged by the end of December 2013 or early January 2014.

6. The List of Experts (Water Leakage)

The Panel worked very hard to finalise the list back in October. Once the recommended fee scale is also finalised, both items will be uploaded to the HKIS Website.

7. Promotional activities via our appointed PR consultant

With the arrangement of our PR consultant, we now have a regular column in the Capital Weekly. The PR consultant also helped us arrange a workshop in June for secondary school students to draw their attention to the problem of unauthorised building works (UBWs), particularly those in sub-divided units. The service agreement with the PR consultant will soon expire and the BSD Council will review its effectiveness while considering how to proceed in its future promotional activities.

8. Monitoring of the renovation work of the new HKIS Beijing Office

Apart from contributing to the monitoring of the renovation work of our new office in Sheung Wan, our fellow building surveyors stationed in Beijing helped renovate our Beijing Office, which opened on 13.11.2013.

9. Regular gatherings with Building Surveyors and the Discussion Forum

Although the first gathering in February 2013 received a very warm response, the proposed second one for August

was cancelled in view of the low number of enrollees. On the other hand, we held a free CPD seminar on 6 August 2013 to facilitate a discussion on the handling of UBWs. Various topics were discussed in the forum convened by the Buildings Department.

10. Enhancing Building Surveyors' expertise in Heritage and Fire Safety

A series of CPD seminars and visits were arranged to enhance members' knowledge of heritage buildings and their conservation. A working group was formed to promote the maintenance of heritage buildings. Concerning fire safety, a panel was also formed after a CPD seminar on fire safety assessment. We hope that our expertise in these areas will be enhanced with the effective operation of the working group and panel.

11. Press Conference and Press Release

We held two press conferences in January and June on UBW-related issues. We proposed a long term strategy in handling UBWs in January and short and medium term strategies in June. Apart from the two press conferences, we issued press releases to announce the publication of the "Guide to Prospective Homebuyers Care on Purchase, Take Over & Fit-out (Second Edition, 2013)" on 22 May 2013. Another press release was issued on 25 September 2013 to express our concern over the new tendering arrangement proposed by the URA.

12. Voluntary Services

The BSD will participate in the Voluntary Service for the Housing Society's Elderly Safe Living Scheme. We will help provide voluntary professional advice on the feasibility and design, as well as supervise and monitor the improvement works in the homes of the elderly.

The BSD will also participate in the Pilot Scheme on the Provision of Professional Advice on the Appointment of APs offered by the Home Affairs Department. The HKIA is another organisation that will join this scheme. We hope that we can assist those owners corporations on their AP appointments for refurbishment work on their buildings.

13. China's Overseas Aid Projects

The BSD met with officers of China's Ministry of Commerce. It was understood that pilot projects will soon be offered to Hong Kong professionals so that they can provide project management cum supervision services in China's overseas aid projects.

I want to tender my sincere thanks to all BSD Council Members, co-opted members, supporters, and administrative staff of Surveyors Service Limited for successfully organising those difficult tasks performed by the various working groups, panels, and committees.

Messrs Tony Gorman and Terry Naylor from the Australian Property Institute ("API") and Blue Hancock from the Property Institute of New Zealand ("PINZ") visited HKIS on 4 November 2013.

HKIS key personnel who hosted them were Sr Stephen Lai, Simon Kwok, Francis Ng, KK Chiu, Joseph Ho and Tony Wan.

During the meeting, we discussed the criteria for becoming professional surveyors/valuers. We also talked about problems of attracting students to enter this profession.

API/PINZ shared with us their arrangements on Continuing Professional Development in which they provided an

e-platform where members can obtain training through the internet. HKIS agreed to explore opportunities in this area.



Singapore Institute of Surveyors and Valuers (SISV)

The President of the Valuation and General Practice Council of SISV, Professor Lim Lan Yuan, visited HKIS on 4 November 2013

HKIS key personnel who hosted Professor Lim were Sr Stephen Lai, Simon Kwok, Francis Ng, KK Chiu and Tony Wan.

At the meeting, Professor Lim said that there would be changes to the structure of SISV and an Extraordinary General Meeting was scheduled for 23 November 2013. It was proposed that there would not be a General Council to oversee administration of the Institute. Instead, the three divisions of the council would operate independently, but under one umbrella. The president of each division would form a committee, but it would have no administrative power.

Professor Lim expressed his appreciation for HKIS's active participation in the development of World Association of Valuation Organisations (WAVO). A Valuation Conference organised by WAVO will be held in India in December 2013. Both SISV and HKIS will lend their support to the event.

We agreed that WAVO should develop the best practices for the valuation profession so that members of all valuation organisations can follow.

SISV and HKIS agreed to investigate how both institutes can further develop their mutual relationship and closer cooperation in the future.

Delegation Visited Beijing under CEPA

HKIS delegation led by the President, Sr Stephen Lai, visited a number of Mainland Government bureaus and professional bodies from 10 to 13 November 2013. These included the Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development (國家住房和城鄉建設部), the Ministry of National Land Resources (國土資源部), the Ministry of Finance (財政部), CIREAA (中國

房地產估價師與房地產經紀人學會), CREVA (中國土地估價師協會), and CAS (中國資產估價師協會). On 12 November, the delegation met with the Deputy Director General, Mr Bái Xingbì (白星碧副司長) of the Ministry of National Land Resources, and Ms Zhǎng Jié (張潔副秘書長) of CREVA. We introduced our role as professional surveyors and the latest

land valuation practices in Hong Kong. We also proposed to mutually recognise professional qualifications with CREVA. We received good response and will follow up on this matter with our counterparts. Later, we met Mr Liú Yùtíng (劉玉廷司長), Director General of the Ministry of Finance and Ms Hán Lìyīng (韓立英副秘書長) of CAS. Again, we elaborated on our role, the latest business valuation practices and

tangible and intangible asset valuation in Hong Kong. At the same time, we proposed to mutually recognise professional qualifications with CAS.

At each meeting, the President agreed to nominate a working group to follow up on the proposal on reciprocity arrangements.

The Third International Valuation Development Conference – Xiamen

HKIS was invited by the School of Economics of Xiamen University to attend the Third International Valuation Development Conference (第三屆資產評估新發展國際會議) from 9-10 November 2013. Sr Elsa NG, co-opted member of GPD Council attended the Conference. Attendees from the Mainland, Hong Kong, Thailand, the U.S.A and Canada shared their views on this year's topic: Valuation – New

Measurement Method of Economic and Social Development. Other valuation topics covered were tangible and intangible asset valuation; the assessment of oil, gas and mineral entities; the valuation of cultural enterprise and practices in China and other countries. We had a chance to introduce valuation practices in Hong Kong and work of HKIS to our fellow participants.



He is also listed on similar panels in Hong Kong and Vancouver, and is appointed as Arbitrator to the China International Economic Trade Arbitration Commission. He is a council member of the Hong Kong International Arbitration Centre and Fellow and Past Chairman of the Hong Kong Institute of Arbitrators (1997-2000).

Since 2006, Sr Lam has been appointed as Honorary Professor to the Real Estate and Construction Department of the University of Hong Kong. For his meritorious contribution to the professions and the public services, Sr Lam was appointed as a non-official Justice of Peace in 1996 and awarded the Bronze Bauhinia Star in 2001.

Chairman's Report for 2012-2013

(a) Growth of the division

The number of members in the Division increased from 63 to 67 this year. This allocation includes fellow, corporate, probationer, and student members broken down as follows:

Such an increase in the member count demonstrated that there is a continuous growth need for planning and development surveyors.

(b) Recognition of the HKU MSc (Urban Planning) Program

The Division has been working closely with universities to train more P&D Surveyors. In early 2013, it reached an agreement with HKU to accept the four-year undergraduate Urban Studies degree as a cognate degree for admission to the APC Examination. The Division also agreed that graduates of the MSc (Urban Planning) programme will be eligible to sit for the PDD APC upon their completion of top-up courses.

(c) Technical Visit to Shanghai

The PDD Council visited Shanghai with the HKIS's

Mainland Committee from 10-12 April 2013. During the three-day visit, we met with academics, government officials, and developers and made significant progress in:

- i. exploring the possibility of setting up courses in Shanghai to train P&D Surveyors;
- ii. promoting P&D Surveyors' services; and
- iii. liaising with HKIS members who work in Shanghai.

The visit successfully opened up more opportunities for cooperation and to further develop P&D Surveyors' professional services in China.

(d) Learning opportunity and liaison with Mainland and international organisations.

- In October, our council members attended the 2013 Mainland and Hong Kong Construction Industry Forum, "Developing Quality and Innovative Construction," to Promote "Going Global," which was jointly organised by the Development Bureau and the Ministry of Housing and Urban Rural Development in Ningbo, China. This is an industry-wide platform for Hong Kong and Mainland construction stakeholders to share their knowledge and experiences, as well as to build networks.
- Our council members took part in a Technical Visit to Liaoning, China in July. We visited several construction and land-related government departments, universities, and leading property developers to share our insights on future growth. At the same time, we exchanged our views on sustainable development.

Chairman's Report for 2012-2013

During the 3rd Meeting of the Property & Facility Management Working Committee under the Office of the Hon. Tony Tse, we deliberated on issues like the problems encountered during the course of enforcing the MWIS, the legislation for licensing Property Management Companies and Practitioners, and the government-proposed Municipal Solid Waste Charging Scheme (MSW). The draft bills of the licensing of Property Management Companies and Practitioners should be ready for submission to LegCo's Bills Committee by December. Committee members are extremely concerned about the qualification requirements for the professional tier group Practitioners, which, we opined, were needed to uphold the high standards of education and professionalism. Tony kindly agreed to follow up with the Home Affairs Department (HAD) to address our concerns. The MSW is another hot topic at the moment and members have discussed the pros and cons of charging a flat or variable rate and the foreseeable problems of implementing the scheme.

Recently, I have invited the Deputy Director of HAD, Mr Jack Chan; the Associate Director, Ms Linda Leung and Franco Kwok to a lunch gathering that the PFMD Vice-Chairman, Sr Edmond Cheng, and Hon Secretary, Sr Prof Eddie Hui, also attended. On behalf of HAD, Mr Chan expressed his deep appreciation for our dedication to the Pilot Scheme for the Provision of Professional Advice to Owner's Corporations on the Appointment of APs for Building Maintenance Works. He added that the Pilot Scheme will be one of HAD's major focuses in 2014 and he is very pleased to work with professional organisations like the HKIS to make the scheme successful.

Chairman's Report - 2013 Annual General Meeting

Reported by Sr Dick Kwok Chairman of the Property and Facility Management Division

Promoting Green Management and Green Buildings

This year, we put additional emphasis on the performance of green management operations and how they could be implemented innovatively. I attended meetings/conferences with other professionals (e.g. architects, engineers, landscape architects, surveyors, and town planners) who all shared the same passion for promoting green buildings in Hong Kong.

Collaboration among different stakeholders is the key to advancing the green building movement. As key stakeholders, we actively participate in and contribute to the cause to improve our environment and save our planet. Moreover, our Council has restarted the drafting of the Green Management Practice Guide with the assistance of a specialised consultant.

In view of the public's rising green awareness and the implementation of more green initiatives for existing buildings, I have contributed to and shared my professional knowledge and experiences as a PFM surveyor for the BEAM Society during my tenure as the nominated director for the 2012-14 term. Moreover, the BEAM Plus Existing Building rating tool is now undergoing a full revamp. We need to place more emphasis on green management operations and energy efficiency rather than simply focusing on building designs and infrastructural aspects.

Due to my involvement in the various task forces and working panels, I have noticed a strong motivation and determination among a group of professionals to improve Hong Kong's carbon emissions record and achieve a sustainable environment.

Involvement in the Government's Legislation and Publications

In January 2013, I attended a Joint Institute Forum co-organised by the six professional institutions in Hong Kong: the HKIA, HKIE, HKILA, HKIP, HKIS, and

HKIUD. That was the first-ever collaboration among the six professional institutions in response to the Chief Executive's Policy Address. The main focus was on the economy, land and housing supply, and the environment. As we eagerly seek a solution to sky-high residential property prices, we must also find a way to strike a balance between developmental needs and environmental protection.

Concurrently, a joint collaboration with the BSD was initiated to provide professional services on a pro bono basis for the Home Affairs Department's (HAD) "Proposed Pilot Scheme for the Provision of Professional Advice to Owners' Corporations on the Appointment of APs for Building Maintenance Works". This pilot scheme aims to advise and provide building owners with samples and basic documents relating to tenders and contracts, help them understand the proper and correct procedures for tendering exercises and procurements, and guide them on how to prepare for owners' meetings in compliance with the meeting procedures, according to the Building Management Ordinance and Deed of Mutual Covenant.

This year, we produced a new publication called "Standard Property Management Agreement" in both English and Chinese. It is the second publication from our last issue of the "HKIS Guide to Good Property Management Practice". We wish to provide the property management industry with a standard document for reference and advocate its broad adoption by owners' corporations.

The 2012 Quality Property and Facility Management Award (QPFMA)

The evening of 26 April 2013 marked a perfect ending to the 2012 QPFMA ceremony. The Award Presentation Banquet was officiated by our Guest of Honour, Mr Wong Kam Sing, JP, and Secretary for the Environment. This year, we placed additional emphasis on the performance of green management operations and how they can be implemented innovatively. To cope with calls to expand the award categories, we extended the coverage in the



residential/non-residential category. As a result, a total of 174 nominations were received. The Jury Panel finally shortlisted 34 winners. I am proud to announce that every award-winning project represented a high standard of quality services and excellence in teamwork. This reflects a wide recognition of the awards and demonstrates the eagerness of practitioners to pursue excellence, professionalism, and service quality. It also echoes our main theme of "Championing innovative service through quality management 服務顯創意管尚優質".

The QPFMA is a biennial award jointly organised by the HKIS and the Hong Kong Association of Property Management Companies (HKAPMC). The award also honours and stimulates greater public recognition of the outstanding projects in the property and facility management industry. All of the award-winning projects delivered contemplative performances in terms of bringing comfort, safety, and security to their users and occupiers, whilst complying with the law and respecting the environment.

CEPA

Our division has been maintaining close contact with the China Property Management Institutes. In March 2013, I joined a reception led by the HKIS's Planning and Development Division (PDD) with guests from the Shanghai Committee of the Chinese Communist Party and the Hong Kong-Shanghai Economic Development Association. I took this opportunity to express our intention to meet with our counterpart institutions in Shanghai and seek their assistance in arranging our first official visit to Shanghai. Later, in August 2013, we joined the CEPA Committee to visit Beijing in order to establish a closer relationship and ties with our Mainland counterparts.

Membership Growth

Membership growth is always our division's concern. In 2013, five new members joined our division, so total membership has now increased to 745. In addition, we welcomed four new probationers for a total of 44 as at November 2013. With efforts made to publicise ourselves to undergraduates, we expect more young graduates to join our division after being informed of the bright career prospects for PFM Surveyors.

CPD Event and Seminars

A total of 22 hours of events, including seminars, conferences, and site visits, were arranged, including a CPD event on "Facility Management for the Elderly in Public and Subsidising Housing" and a tour to Mei Ho House, which is now designated a Grade 2 Historical Building. The events received an overwhelming response from members.

Furthermore, I represented the HKIS in presenting a paper on "Asset Appreciation through Life Cycle Management" in a seminar on "Sustainability in Asset Management," which was organised by The Hong Kong Quality Assurance Agency for practitioners such as property developers, facility managers, and asset managers. The talk was well-received by participants.

Our CPD work group organised a number of CPD events for the second half of 2013, which included a site visit to the Grand Award Winners of QPFMA 2012, a hotel management talk, a Mandatory Building and Window Inspection Scheme that focused on the property management aspect, a tour of the Yau Ma Tei Theatre, etc

The Way Forward

Our Council has been making every effort to forward members' concerns to the HAD regarding the legislation to license property management companies and practitioners. The coming year will be challenging, as the draft bill will be put before LegCo by late-2013 and we expect to see the introduction of the aforementioned legislation.

Finally, I wish to thank Council members for their valuable contributions to and unfailing support for the growth and development of the division. Without your efforts, the Council would not have achieved so much. Also, thank you for supporting your fellow members and I look forward to the continued success of the division in the coming year.

to provide such extensive services by their clients. In fact, it is not common for Mainland clients in the Pearl River Delta Region to request consultants to provide a full scope of quantity surveying services for their projects.

The panel discussion was well received by the delegation. For closing remarks, 余建平站長 and 嚴偉鋒會長 invited the Council to visit them and organise a seminar for their members in the future.



Formulae to Formulate the "Head Office Overheads"

1. Introduction

A losses and/or expenses contract clause commonly exists in the frequently-used Conditions of Contract in Hong Kong. For losses and/or expenses claims, heads of claims generally include site overheads, head office overheads ("HO OH"), loss of profits, and finance charges. Assessors of HO OH usually look at the loss of opportunity ("LOO") approach (the "formula approach") or the actual cost approach. In this article, I shall focus only on the LOO approach.

In the LOO approach, it is assumed that because of the delay, the contractor's organization is unable to move on to another project (i.e., another opportunity) and earn the combined profit and HO OH, of which it is reasonably capable. The saying goes that "the opportunity to earn elsewhere is lost". Sir William Stabb, QC, 1 said:

It is generally accepted that, on principle, a contractor who is delayed in completing a contract due to the default of his employer, may properly have a claim for head office overheads during the period of delay, on the basis that the work-force might have had the opportunity of being employed on another contract which would have had the effect of funding the overheads during the overrun period.

2. Hudson's Formula

This formula was published in the book, *Hudson's Building* and *Engineering Contracts*, as follows:

It was accepted in several court cases, but all of them occurred many years ago. More recently, the formula has been criticized for using the HO OH percentage from the contract as the factor to calculate those costs that may bear little or no relation to the actual HO OH costs for the contractor during the extended/delayed period.

3. Emden's Formula

In order to try to improve Hudson's Formula, another formula emerged from the book, *Emden's Building Contracts and Practice*. This was Emden's Formula:

Unlike Hudson's Formula, Emden's Formula has the advantage of extracting the contractor's actual HO OH percentage from the audited account(s) of the contractors to assess the HO OH costs. Thus, it has received plenty of recent judiciary support.³

I find Emden's Formula quite useful and have used it in several of my assessments of the HO OH of the prolongation costs, provided that the contractor could prove a loss of HO OH and/or profits due to a delay by the employer.

4. Eichleay's Formula

Someone may argue that if the LOO cannot be proved, then both of the above formulae cannot be used. I am of the opinion that this is quite right. As a result, the third formula below may be used to assess the HO OH under this scenario, which someone claims is likely based on "actual costs" instead.

Eichleay's Formula:

Total HO OH assessed =A $\times \frac{\text{Period of Delay}}{\text{Contract Period}}$

I recently used this formula to assess the HO OH for the prolongation costs, as applied by the contractors, and found it to be very useful. In my opinion, this formula fairly and reasonably assesses the HO OH, since it compares the value of the works carried out in the contract for the project, for which the contractor claimed the prolongation cost, to the total value of the works carried out by the contractor as a whole during the above contract period. Usually, the consultant quantity surveyor can advise on the value of the works carried out in the contract (from, say, the final account prepared) to claim a prolongation cost, whilst both the total value of the works for the company and the total HO OH can be found in the contractor's audited accounts.

Moreover, the audited accounts of the contractors referred to should be included at least one year (preferably two years) before and include the contract period⁴ for that particular

project, so as to average out the irregularities and include the information for the relevant years, as advised by the court.⁵

Hon Reyes J.

Here I accept Mr. Molloy (Mr. John Molloy)'s reasoning. He chose a 4 year average of head office overhead/turnover percentage to obtain a more balanced overhead percentage. Mr. Molloy reasoned that, while the contract period was covered by the years 2003 and 2004, the Contractor would have most likely based its tender on the 2 years preceding the contract period" (bracket added by the author).

For instance, if the contract period was from 2009 to 2010, then it should be better to select audited accounts for the years 2007, 2008, 2009, and 2010 for assessment/averaging.
