The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors Introduces “Create Your District” Competition 2017

A Competition to inspire and award talented students,
as well as promote the surveying industry

(Hong Kong) 25 May 2017 – The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors (HKIS) launched its “Create Your District” Competition 2017 at a ceremony to correspond with the celebration of the 20th anniversary of the establishment of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region. **Mr Eric Ma Siu Cheung, JP**, Secretary of Development, the HKSAR Government; HKIS President **Sr Thomas HO** and Vice-President **Sr Dr Lesly LAM** participated as officiating guests.

The HKIS inaugurated “Create Your District” Competition 2017 to encourage students to demonstrate their creativity by designing an ideal community while considering governmental challenges and environmental management. The Competition also aims to promote the surveying industry by demonstrating its role in city development to younger generations.

“Surveying is a profession that is critical to city development, especially when it comes to land planning, architectural design, cost control, building use and management,” said **Sr Thomas HO, the HKIS President**. “The Institute is encouraging students to take an interest in the surveying profession and Hong Kong’s future development through interactions with our members.”

“Sham Shui Po is the first district selected for the competition because it is one of the earliest developed areas in Hong Kong; it is comprised of rich, historic buildings and its residents display strong community engagement,” said **Sr Dr Lesly LAM, the HKIS Vice-President** and chairman of the competition’s organising committee. “We hope students can learn more about the rich history and cultural traditions of different areas; this will be HKIS’s initiative for forthcoming competitions.”

The “Create Your District” Competition 2017 is accepting Form 3 to Form 6 entries until 28 July 2017. Different forms of submissions that present Sham Shui Po in an ideal state creatively will be accepted.

Guided tours organised by the HKIS will take students to visit modern buildings and conserved monuments in Sham Shui Po. Students will have an opportunity to appreciate the importance of Hong Kong’s sustainable development and learn more about surveyors’ scope of work, including building revitalisation and
