The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors Launches

"Create Your District Competition 2018"

(Hong Kong, 7 July 2018) - The Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors (HKIS) held the workshops and guided tour of "Create Your District Competition 2018" today. Following the success of last year's competition, the HKIS again organised this local community development competition with a new twist this year. **HKIS President Sr Dick Kwok and HKIS Vice-President Sr Billy Wong**, who chairs the competition's organising committee, joined the guided tour of Wanchai, which attracted over 100 students. During the tour, students gained an in-depth understanding of the history and culture of the Wan Chai District. At the same time, they familiarised themselves with the role played by surveyors in district conservation and urban revitalisation.

"This is the second consecutive year that the HKIS has organised this competition, and overwhelming responses had been received in the past," **said Sr Dick Kwok**, **President of the HKIS**. "Not only does the Competition help the younger generation understand the roles played by professional surveyors in Hong Kong's city development, it also enables them to take an interest in community surroundings, to ponder over environment policy and management problems, and to look for ways and directions to sustain the development of Hong Kong, and lastly, to build an ideal community together."

Last year, when the HKIS first launched this competition, it achieved outstanding results. The entries from students were well thought-out with a good understanding of the work of surveyors. This year's competition focuses on the district of Wan Chai, a district where East meets West and the old and new come together. The main objectives of the competition are to enlighten the younger generation on the roles and contributions of surveyors in terms of city development, especially on



revitalisation, conservation and redevelopment; to encourage students to observe and reflect on the surroundings, policies and management of their neighbourhood communities; and make use of their creativity to establish an ideal community that demonstrates the importance of sustainable development of Hong Kong. "Engage, Mentor, Growth and Connect" is the theme of the HKIS this year, and the competition is a good way to promote the surveying industry to the younger generation, in the hopes that some young people will become surveyors.

Sr Billy Wong, Vice-President of the HKIS and the Chairman of the Organising Committee of the "Create your District Competition 2018", said: "Wan Chai is a district with a rich history and distinctive cultural traditions. Besides having pre-war buildings, it also has novel architectures. These profound implications are worthy for students to explore the district, and were the reasons why Wan Chai was selected as the theme of this year's competition. We look forward to guiding students to appreciate other districts through this competition in the next few years."

To enhance public awareness, the HKIS will organise a public tour on 16 September. Participants can explore the Wan Chai District together with surveyor docents. From city development to heritage conservation, from old district management to redevelopment, the public can gain a better understanding of the roles surveyors play in city development.
